EXECUTED MISSIONS FOR NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Rwanda Mission: INES-Ruhengeri

Prof. de Vries carried out a needs assessment of INES, in Rwanda during the period of 4 – 6 December 2017. The mission led to a brief documentation of the role of INES in Land Management, its position in NELGA and EALAN Network, its relevance as NELGA and ADLAND partner; and its immediate needs in terms of research and capacity development in land governance.

Ghana Mission: KNUST

Dr. Chigbu, was in Ghana (KNUST) on a consultation mission from 6-8 December 2017. He brought back a brief report on the land governance capacity of KNUST as an Excellency Centre in West Africa. The report also included the immediate needs of KNUST in the context of NELGA/ADLAND activities, combined with a time plan that was based on the KNUST staff inputs.

Tanzania Mission: Ardhi University

Dr. Hendricks visited Ardhi University (Tanzania) from 5-8 December 2017 to carry out a needs assessment of the Ardhi University as part of the fact-finding mission of ADLAND.

Namibia Mission: NUST

Prof. Voß visited NUST (Namibia) during the period of 12-13 April 2018. There he conducted a needs assessment of NUST which has been integrated in the activities of ADLAND in Southern Africa.

PROJECTS / ACTIVITIES ALREADY IMPLEMENTED

The consultation missions conducted in Ghana, Namibia, Rwanda and Tanzania revealed the needs of the collaborating NELGA nodes and established the basis to agree on dates for the core activities of ADLAND.
